The game never gets raunchy, just edgy enough to keep things interesting and fun. Laugh until your stomach hurts kind of fun.

Kerri and Patti (<http://www.gamesfordames.com/story.htm>), sisters and the brains behind the game, created What's a Dame to Do?!® because they couldn't find a really fun and easy-to-play game for grown-up ladies. Since introducing the game last November, they've been hosting regular Dame Game Nights for their friends and getting lots of emails from females around the country doing the same. "It provides a great reason to carve out some time to spend with our girlfriends and laugh off all the stresses of the week with them, which we believe is vital to our mental health," states Kerri. "Also, laughing together over these little situations, even though they're light and funny, still makes me realize every time I play, that I'm not the only female having these dumb things happen to me! Even if you don't win, it's still a feel-good experience."

The game is unusual in that it's perfect for grown-up "dames" (17+) of all ages.
